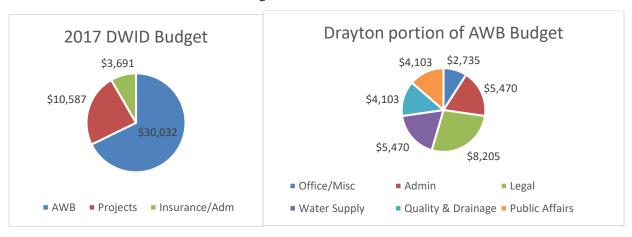
II. Administrative

- B. Comprehensive Plan preparation Heather
 - Prepared the draft document for website

- D. 2018 Workplan & Budget

III. Water Quality

- A. Monitoring Results David indicated few samples had been collected. Those that were collected were good.
- B. South Lynden source tracking project slow progress on DNA work on Scott Ditch.
- C. DNA David noted the recent DNA report for the Lummis. No evidence of bovine reported in the initial results.

IV. Drainage/Habitat

- A. Ditch maintenance there are not may areas in the WID that have needs other than those already covered in the DIDs.
- B. 5-year programmatic permit Frank will work on this in 2018.
- C. Floodplain Implementation Plan David alerted the Board to a November 2, 10am meeting where Ned Currence of the Nooksack Tribe will be presenting on fish needs. He felt this would be a great opportunity for WID members to ask questions to both better understand the fish issues and to challenge the fish advocates on conflicting stories

V. Water Supply

A. Birch Bay Water & Sewer – Deep Aquifer project – Dan reported that pump tests on the third well were forthcoming. The deep well drilled by Ferndale will also be tested soon. He hopes to have a draft of the feasibility study for moving the water in November.

- B. Hirst Dan and Greg have been meeting with Eric. They are finding some common ground that will help us make our points about where laws need changing.
- C. Water Supply Work Group report Henry updated the Board on the following elements which are beginning to build towards a renewed "Drainage Based Management" effort to implement the county-wide strategies developed in the Watershed Management Plan.
 - Renewed push for drainage by drainage negotiations leading to binding agreements
 - Support from State via \$450k budget request
 - Supported by the Planning Unit
 - Support building via Baker to Bay and upcoming Water Supply symposium
 - Augmentation options to increase stream flows use of conversions and pump and dump
