- Legal June 3rd group WID mtg. AWB is planning an evening meeting on the 3rd to discuss the meeting with Lummi and the fall strategy session.
 - 1) Lummi proposed water negotiations June 3rd. There was discussion over accepting the invitation should accept and if so with what terms. The CRM experience with Lummi pulling out caused dairy farmers to be reluctant to participate in a meeting without a neutral facilitator. But the majority felt that we should accept the invitation as offered. Who should go and what should be said was discussed. Consensus was to defer to the AWB to make those decisions.
