Goals:

- **Water Quantity:** Plan together for water access now and for future generations by preserving land values, water rights and agricultural viability in Whatcom County. Work with current monitoring agencies to understand, influence and support water quantity issues
- **Drainage Management:** Implement proactive and informed solutions to drainage issues.
- **Financial Stability:** Develop a structure to maintain support from WID members and establish secure additional funding for legal needs, mitigation, education, research and outreach.
- **Water Quality:** Work together to lower nitrate and fecal coliform counts in aquifers, rivers and bays of Whatcom County. Work with current monitoring agencies to understand, influence and support water quality issues.
- **Flood Management:** Cooperate with County Flood Board to ensure that farmland is not lost to erosion from river meandering.

- **Education and Outreach:** Education for urban communities, primary school and higher education to ensure the next generation of farmers, policy makers and consumers value agriculture as an integral part of Whatcom County economy. Work with community groups, farm organizations, the press, colleges and universities to clear up misunderstandings, assumptions and stereotypes of agriculture.
